# Adult Events Updated

At the 2012 ISA AGM, the following changes were passed that affect Adult Events, from the 1<sup>st</sup> May 2012.

All test requirements are the minimum required to compete in a particular level, but skaters can have a higher test level and compete in the section.

#### Changes to elements and music timing

Adult Bronze Singles section music timing will now be max of 1 min 50 secs.

Changes to all Singles and Pairs section, skaters will no longer perform a Spiral or a Step Sequence. Skaters are to perform a maximum of one choreo-step sequence (ChSt) or choreo-spiral sequence (ChSp.)

To be confirmed as performed a spiral sequence must include at least two (2) spiral positions not less than three (3) seconds long each or only one (1) spiral position not less than six (6) seconds long. Only the first executed attempt of a choreo-step sequence or choreo-spiral sequence will contribute to the technical score.

Additional spiral sequences and step sequences will not be counted in the technical score but will be counted as moves-in-the field (transitions) and marked as such.
