SOUTH AUSTRALIA'S best amateur golfers will pair up this weekend to contest the State Foursome Championships at the Adelaide Golf Links in North Adelaide.

Held by Golf SA on Sunday, the 36-hole stroke play tournament has attracted a top-notch field, including Golf Australia national squad member Jordan Sherratt who, earlier this week, contested the Stoke Play qualifying at the Canadian Amateur Championship in Quebec. Sherratt will partner SA's state men's captain Max McCardle.


The pair will enter the competition as strong favourites, but are sure to face stiff opposition from 2008 runners-up Matt Butler and Matt McGowan.

Two-time state amateur champion Chris Austin will pair with Stephen Speirs; a combination also capable of upsetting the favourites.

In the women's event, 2008 State Foursomes Champion Sarah King will be without last year's partner Stephanie Na, who has turned professional. King will partner with Glenelg's Josie Hodge.

Their main rival will be Emma Ash and Ebony Heard, who has had a stellar 2009. Royal Adelaide duo Caitlin Roberts and Jovanna Bozanic will also challenge for the title in the women's event.



TWENTY-EIGHT skaters, a judge, two technical specialists, a data entry operator and four coaches will represent South Australia at this weekend's 2009 Australian Figure Skating Championships in Sydney.

The synchronised skating events will be held in Penrith tomorrow and Sunday, while the singles ladies and men, pairs and ice dancing will begin on Monday and conclude next Saturday.

South Australia has a proud history at the national championships, winning gold medals from 2003-06. For the first time since 2004 SA will be represented by a pairs team – Amy Newbery (12) and Joshua Broad (15).
